

QUESTIONS BY COLONEL HINKELE TO THE WITNESS THROUGH THE INTERPRETER:

Q What is your name?

A Doctor Hans Frank.

Q You have now been served with a copy of the indictment in this case in which you are accused, as a defendant, of the commission of various crimes. It is expected that you will continue to be interrogated from time to time unless you expressly object thereto. Please state whether you have any objection to being further interrogated, or whether you consider that your interests will be better protected by refusing to be interrogated further.

A I am agreeable to be interrogated further. I should like to make the request, since I have asked for defending counsel who is about to arrive from Munich, that the time for my interrogations be given in advance and not very suddenly, not the last moment but with notice, so that I am not fetched from myself suddenly when I am in the middle of talking to counsel, if that is possible.

Q Your request will be taken under advisement. That will be all.
