DR. NEUMAYR, FORMER FINANCE MINISTER, TO BE TRIED

The ministers: Albert Hagelin (of the interior), Sverre Riisnaes (justice), Rolf Fuglesang (propaganda) and Axel Stang (sports) will be put on trial jointly.

NORSK PROTEST ON TRAITORS' TREATMENT

Trondhjem- Mass meeting was held this afternoon (Sept. 10) on Market Square, arranged by the Troendelag Joint Trade Unions as a protest against the way the settlement with traitors is being carried out. About 20,000 people attended the meeting. The editor, Joorgen Vogt, Chairman of the Joint Trade Unions Arne Forseth, and a storeroom foreman, Haaken Johnsen, made speeches.
