1. MESSENGER SERVICE: Everyone in this building is urged to put the name and room number very clearly on all documents to be delivered through the messenger service.
2. SUNDAY TRIPS: There are no more accommodations available for the Sunday trips.
3. O.C.C. PERSONNEL - MAIL DELIVERY: Members of the Office of U.S. Chief of Counsel are kindly requested not to call in person for their mail at Rm 182. Mail will be delivered much faster by messenger if the mail clerks are not called upon to search for an individual's mail.
4. IMT STICKERS FOR AUTOMOBILES: All persons having automobiles without an IMT sticker attached to the windshield, must apply one thereto by 0700 on 16 November. Stickers may be obtained in the Security Office, Room 10.
5. CHANGE IN EATING PLACE FOR GERMAN TYPISTS: Persons concerned are requested to advise any German typists whom they may have in their offices that such typists should take their lunches at L Company, 26th Infantry, directly across from the Palace of Justice, from 1200 to 1230 hours.
6. MEALS AT THE GRAND HOTEL: The following is again brought to the attention of all personnel concerned. Breakfast at the Grand Hotel is served from 0730 until 0900. Dinner is served from 1200 until 1330, and supper from 1730 until 2030. These hours will have to be strictly observed. No service will be requested by any member of the O.C.C. outside of the normal meal hours indicated above. It is further recalled that the day's work at the Court House is started at 0900, and that personnel having breakfast at the Grand Hotel are expected to leave not later than 0850, taking advantage of the last bus which departs from the Hotel at 0850. The dinner hours above are quoted for the benefit of the few persons who may have to and are authorized to take their dinner at noon at the Grand Hotel. All others will make it a practice to take their noon meal at the Court House Cafeteria. Finally, everyone is reminded of the fact that personnel should eat in the mess nearest to their billets, rather than at the Grand Hotel.
