24 November 1945

1. IMMUNIZATION: All OCC personnel who have not received an injection of influenza vaccine will do so before the end of next week in Rm 24. Please take care of this as soon as possible. You must bring your Immunization Card with you.

2. ELECTRIC CURRENT IN NURNBERG: There will be no electricity on the city system on the following days: for direct current - Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays from 0700 to 1100; and for AC or alternating current - Tuesdays from 0800 to 1200, Wednesdays from 1200 to 1600, Fridays from 0800 to 1200, and on Saturdays from 1200 to 1600. The reason for this is low level water in the Munich area and the Bavarian Alps which supply most of the power to the Nurnberg area.

3. MATERIAL AVAILABLE TO ALLIED PERSONNEL: As per agreement with the respective Allied Government Representatives, Allied personnel in Nurnberg will be given Post Exchange and billeting facilities. The United States Army does not accept any responsibility for furnishing clothing, personal equipment, etc., to Allied Personnel.

4. WAR DEPT. AGO CARDS FOR AMERICAN PERSONNEL: All American military and civilian personnel who do not have their WD AGO cards will please report to Lt. Rowand, AC, Room 172, Administrative Division as soon as possible.

5. NURNBERG OPERA HOUSE REVISED SCHEDULE: Saturday, 24 Nov. at 1930, movie - "The Falcon in San Francisco". Sunday, 25 Nov. at 1400 - Concert, the classics in miniature with string quartet, featuring selections from Hayden, Carl Leewe and Beethoven. Sunday, 25 Nov. at 1930, stage show "Section Eight". November 27, 28, 29 and 30 at 1930, the successful stage play "Blithe Spirit", with Alexander Kirkland and a cast of seven. Tickets for "Blithe Spirit" may be obtained at the Opera House.

No tickets are required for the Sunday concert.
