## MEMORANDUM TO THE CHIEF OF COUNSEL

In carrying out our Public Relations policy in connection with the trial of the major war criminals, there are several points in which the United States Army particularly the Public Relations Division of USFET can be of great assistance to us. If they are to render in general terms, and that we also request in specific terms the assistance both in terms of personnel and equipment which we will need from them. I have attempted to do this in the attached memorandum.

If you approve, it was my plan to transmit the memorandum immediately to Colonel Gill who will in turn pass it on to the appropriate officials in PRD, USFET, particularly Colonel Fitzgerald who will for the next few days be in Paris and who has already been in contact with Colonel Gill.

The most immediate needs are in the field of (1) accrediting of newspaper correspondents, (2) billeting, messing and transportation for the newspaper men, and (3) communications.
