MEMORANDUM FOR COMMANDER DONOVAN.

Subject: Still Photographs.

1. This will refer to your memorandum of 23 October 1945 on the above subject.

2. Due to lack of personnel, and to the sub-division of the work of Section 3 among the officers assigned to this section, it is not feasible to designate a single officer familiar with all aspects of the work of Section 3, as requested.

3. Instead each officer in Section 3 will, with respect to subject matter assigned to him, deal with photographic evidence relevant to that subject matter. Those subject matters and the officers assigned thereto are:

a. Status of the conspiracy by the middle of 1933 and projected plans, including abrogation of the Treaty of Versailles through 1936.

b. Aggressive action against Austria.

c. Aggression against Czechoslovakia and Poland.

d. Expansion of the war into a general war of aggression.

e. Aggression against USSR.

Lt. Gorrell

f. Collaboration with Italy and Japan and aggressive war against U.S.

4. It will be appreciated if you will bring to our attention such photographic evidence, still or motion

picture, as may be available hearing on the allegations of paragraph IV (F) of the Indictment, indicating the particular subdivision of the subject matter to which it is relevant, and the point thought to be established by the evidence.

5. In view of the deadline imposed for presenting trial briefs to the Review Board, 10 November 1945, the responsibility for covering photographic evidence stated in paragraph 6 of General Memorandum No. 5, and the fact that no part of this evidence has heretofore been considered by the personnel of Section 3, the matter is now an urgent one.
