Subject: Indictment against Goering and Doenitz.

During my last stay in Berlin I heard through a reliable intermediary that the Russians had found files which showed the following: Two well known German officers, the Air Force Colonel MOELDERS and the Sea Captain PRIEN, who according to a communique of the German Armed Forces, had died in service, are said on orders of Hitler to have been taken to a concentration camp because of their political unreliability, and had perished in the camp. If it is possible to prove this allegation, this fact would have a tremendous effect on the German people.

I therefore propose to have Goering interrogated concerning the fate of MOELDERS, and Doenitz concerning the fate of PRIEN. Both should know about the actual circumstances.
