

MEMO TO: Captain Nordon.

In compliance with your request over the telephone on 14 November, around noon time, I immediately contacted Goering's lawyer, Dr. Stahmer, whether he would agree that Goering be confronted with Hess in the presence of the interrogators.

Goering's defence lawyer agreed that he would not object to such proceeding. I immediately notified Captain Nordon from whom I learned that Major Monigan had called off the interrogation. I thereupon informed Dr. Stahmer that he could see his client at once because there would be no interrogation according to the information received from Captain Nordon.

In other words, as far as General Donovan's office and Goering's lawyer, with whom I talked personally, are concerned, Goering was available for interrogation yesterday afternoon if he was needed.
